Deliverance was central to the ministry of Jesus

...then He healed many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons; ... (Mark 1:34.)

And He was preaching in their synagogues throughout all Galilee, and casting out demons. (Mark 1:39.)


Jesus expected his followers to do deliverance

And as you go, preach, saying, "The kingdom of heaven is at hand." Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out demons. Freely you have received, freely give (Matt. 10:7-8).

In Luke 10, speaking of the seventy, Luke records: Then the seventy returned with joy, saying, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us in Your name" (Luke 10: 17).

When commencing ministry ask for help from the Holy Spirit

Step 1. Give the individual priority.

Step 2. If a spirit is manifesting, or if one manifests during your ministry, make the spirit be quiet and submit to you in the name of Jesus.

Step 3. Establish, and maintain, communication with the prayee.

Step 4. Ask the prayee what he wants to be free from, and try to make sure he actually wants to get free.

Step 5. Make sure the prayee has accepted Jesus as his Savior and Lord.

Step 6. Interview the prayee to discover the event or events, or the relationship situations, that have led to his bondage or bondages.

Step 7. Lead the prayee in "closing" these "doors" to the admission of spirits.

Step 8. Cast out the unclean spirit or (usually) spirits in the name of Jesus.

Step 9. Ask the prayee to praise and thank Jesus for his deliverance.

Step 10. Ask the prayee to pray for the Holy Spirit to fill him, to fill all the places formerly occupied by the evil spirits.
